

Evaluating costs and finding ways to save money is challenging. The Board of Trustees has always operated in a fiscally conservative manner and through continuous analysis, we have consistently worked to moderate expenses while avoiding cuts that might adversely affect the services the Library provides. This past year, we replaced our outdated HVAC units, utilizing a 50% NYS Construction grant and PSEG rebate to significantly lower the cost while continuing to grow our Library of Things and Museum Pass collections. **Despite being faced with a stringent tax cap of 2% as required by the NYS Office of the Comptroller, we have managed to stay within this limitation and meet the tax cap required by the State.** We encourage you to visit the Library on Tuesday, April 2, 2024, and vote, so we can continue to provide our residents with the services that are valued so highly in our community.
